A Guide for Schools

Why Acknowledge Our Support?

Strengthening education by giving students opportunities in the fine arts is a focus of the Oklahoma Arts Council's mission. By acknowledging Oklahoma Arts Council support, schools receiving our grant funding build awareness of our work to impact education across the state.

As outlined in our grant contracts, schools receiving Oklahoma Arts Council funding must acknowledge our support of their programs. They must also acknowledge the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), which provides funding to the Oklahoma Arts Council.

How to Acknowledge Our Support

There are up to two required ways for schools to acknowledge our support. Two additional ways are encouraged but not required. Ways to acknowledge our support include:

1. Write and Invite Your *State Legislators (Required)

Schools must inform their state senator and state representative in writing about grant awards from the Oklahoma Arts Council. State legislators like to know how state funding is impacting schools in their districts. After receiving your award notice, please do the following:

- 1. Notify your state senator and state representative in writing about your award.
- 2. Describe how the funding will make a difference in your students' education.
- 3. Invite them to experience your program in person. Offer them the opportunity to speak to your class or give remarks if your program features an event.
- 4. Thank them for their support.



Identifying Your State Legislators

A search feature is available at <u>oklegislature.gov</u> to help you identify the state senator and state representative who serves your organization's district. Be sure to use your organization's physical address (not mailing address) when completing the form. (See screenshot).

State vs. Federal

Keep in mind your state legislators serve at the Oklahoma State Capitol in Oklahoma City where they make decisions about the state budget and appropriations for the Oklahoma Arts Council. By comparison, your federal representatives from Oklahoma serve in the U.S. Congress in Washington, D.C., where they make decisions about the federal budget, including National Endowment for the Arts funding. 2. Download and Display Our "Supported by the Oklahoma Arts Council" Sign (Required for Open Events)

If our grant is supporting a school performance, exhibition, or other school arts-related event that is <u>open to family, friends, or the community</u>, download this sign and display it at the event. Not every program will include an open event, and in those cases a sign is not required. Ideas for placement include a check-in table, ticket booth, entry door, or other highly visible location.

3. Download and Use Our Logo (Optional but Encouraged)

Schools are encouraged to download and include logos from the Oklahoma Arts Council and National Endowment for the Arts on promotional materials for school arts programs funded by our agency. Examples of promotional materials include fliers, posters, printed programs, and newsletters. (Logos should be readable and should not be altered. Logos should be sized proportionally to original dimensions.)

Introduce yourself and your role at your school. Inform your state senator/representative that your school received a grant award from the Oklahoma Arts Council.

Describe your program and how it will benefit students who are represented by the state senator/representative in the Oklahoma State Legislature.

Explain how Oklahoma Arts Council and National Endowment for the Arts funding plays an important role in making arts education programs like yours and hundreds of others possible in schools and communities across the state.

Express gratitude for your senator/representative's support of the Oklahoma Arts Council. Describe how the arts are important to educational outcomes and workforce development in Oklahoma.

Invite them to visit to see students involved in the program. Provide the date, time, and location. Offer them the opportunity to give remarks, if there is an opportunity.

Thank them again for their support.
